About THE WINNER

THE WINNER, a fascinating new musical by Lewis Flinn and Joe Sutton, tells the story of the defining election of Lyndon Johnson's political career. THE WINNER is also a love story between Lyndon Baines Johnson and his wife Lady Bird. Finally, it relates the tale of one of the dirtiest, most vicious, most colorful campaigns in the history of our country – LBJ's notorious Senate race of 1948. In this race, Duvall County delivered LBJ an additional 202 votes a week after the primary runoff, giving Johnson an 87 vote margin of victory and the nickname, "Land-slide Lyndon."

With his trusted campaign manager John Connally, LBJ re-wrote the rulebook on modern politics. And through it all, Johnson's wife Lady Bird looked on with worry and finally intervened. With love and compassion, but more than anything, with a sense of ethics that her husband often lacked, Lady Bird fought for the man she loved – and in doing so, she delivered to her state and her country a man she could be proud of: The man who eventually became the 36th President of the United States.

GIGI CERVANTES (Lady Bird Johnson) has been seen at WaterTower Theatre, Circle Theatre, Stage West, and Casa Manana. Gigi teaches at the Fort Worth Academy of Fine Arts, and is also an award-winning singer/songwriter. She has recorded two CDs, *One of those Years* and *Nothing but Angels*.

JOSHUA DOSS (John Connally) This is Joshua's second production with Lyric Stage, previously portraying Matt in *The Fantasticks*. Most recently he could be seen as Bobby Strong in WaterTower Theatre's *Urinetown*, for which he won the 2006 Leon Rabin Award for Best Actor in a Musical.

RAY GESTAUT (George Parr) Has been seen this year in Theater Fusions' *Twelfth Night* as Sir Toby Belch, and as Bob in *Tough Choices For The New Century* at the Echo theatre. He directed *Deathtrap* at the Labyrinth Theatre as well. Travelling in music, radio, film (his second feature film, *Infamous*, is due out on video this month), and even circus clowning, Ray always returns to his first love, the live theatre. He's thrilled to be at Lyric, and would like to thank you all for supporting our efforts in creating real American Theatre!

BEN GIDDINGS (Ensemble) is excited to be returning to Lyric Stage after being seen in *Ragtime* and *Sweeney Todd*. Other works in the DFW Metroplex include Casa Manana at Bass Hall and Garland Summer Musicals. He can usually be found behind the scenes as Producer/director of regional and political commercials.

STAN GRANER (Shook/Sonny Bailey) is making his fifth appearance for Lyric Stage, having been seen previously in *The Most Happy Fella* (Leon Rabin nomination), *The Pajama*

Game, Roadside, and Joseph and Mary. Look for Stan later this year in *Parade* at WaterTower Theatre, and *Caroline or Change* at Theatre Three. Other theaters he's appeared at include Casa Mañana, Classical Acting Company, Kitchen Dog Theatre, Circle Theatre, Stage West, and Plano Repertory Theatre.

MADELINE HENDRICK (Ensemble) Madeline has previously been seen in the Imagination Players productions of *CATS* as Carbucketty, and *Rudolph's Holiday Inn* as Dancer. She takes piano and is in her seventh year of dance. She is a fourth grade student at Hyer Elementary.

LINDSEY HOLLOWAY (Nellie Connally) is honored to be a part of *The Winner*. CHANCE JONAS-O'TOOLE (Ensemble) is 10 yrs old and is a 5th grader at Whitters Elementary. This is his first time with Lyric Stage and is so proud to be apart of this cast. LINDA BLASE (Lighting Designer), a recipient of two Dallas

Theatre Critics Forum Awards and a 6-time Leon Rabin Award-winning designer, has designed lighting for more than 325 professional productions in a career that spans more years than she'd like to admit. Locally, she has designed for Lyric Stage, Dallas Children's Theater, Dallas Theater Center, Theater Three, Echo Theater, Teatro Dallas, and Kitchen Dog Theater, and has worked in Florida, Kentucky, Alabama, and New York, including The Lamb's Theatre Off Broadway.

She also has extensive experience as a professional photographer specializing in theatre. Her work has appeared in numerous local and national publications, including *The New York Times*, *London Times*, *Dallas Morning News*, *Dallas Times Herald*, *Texas Monthly*, *D Magazine*, *People*, *US*, *Dialogue*, *Time*, *American Theatre* (cover photo April, 2003), and *Saturday Review* (cover photo, May 15, 1976). Her theatre photographs have been exhibited at the Warehouse Theatre and Gallery in Corsicana, Theatre Three, the Dallas Public Library, and the Irving Arts Center.

BILL EICKENLOFF (Sound Designer) is in his second season as Sound Designer for Lyric Stage. Elsewhere, he has worked for various theatres as well as The Leon Rabin Awards Ceremony and The Column Awards Gala. **WADE J. GIAMPA** (scenic designer) *The Winner* is Wade's 23rd production, of those 10 being world premieres, that he has designed for Lyric Stage since it's 1999-2000 season. His last design for Lyric was *Cabin In The Sky*. In between these two shows he designed *A Critical Case Of Murder!* for the Pegasus Theater, presented in their famous black and white style, which received much accolades. Wade's other productions

have been seen throughout the Metroplex and is the recipient of numerous Rabin and Column On Line nominations and is an award designer. Currently he is preparing his next production for Uptown Players' *Die, Mommie, Die!*.

LEWIS FLINN (music) current musical projects include *Lysistrata Jones*, with book by Douglas Carter Beane; *On, Girl*, with book and lyrics by Steven Sater and featuring legendary Jennifer Holliday; *Like Love*, with book/lyrics by Barry Kaplan; and *Down There*, with book/lyrics by Brian Crawley, which will be presented by the Boston Conservatory in April 2007. He and Brian Crawley contributed a song, *Little While Lies*, to the 2005 Drama Desk Nominated musical, *The Audience*. His songs have been recorded by many artists, including Jennifer Holliday, and were recently featured in Lincoln Center's American Songbook series. He has also composed scores and songs for over 50 productions including the Broadway play *The Little Dog Laughed*, and recent Off-Broadway productions at Second Stage Theater, Playwright's Horizons, Drama Dept., Lincoln Center Theatre, The Vineyard Theater, Geffen Playhouse (LA), Hartford Stage, Cleveland Play House, Old Globe (San Diego), Primary Stages, adobe theatre co, and the Acting Company. In addition, he has been a guest artist at Cornell, Dartmouth, and Princeton University. He also composes scores for commercials (recent campaigns include Microsoft, Life Cereal, SAAB, and the AFL-CIO), film and fashion. A CD of his runway music for designer Zang Toi was recently released under the pseudonym "Flash". He was lead singer and songwriter for the 90's jazz/rock

band *Acoustic Blue*. He is graduate of Princeton University and Phillips Exeter Academy.

PETER HACKETT (Stage Director) is currently the Chair of the Theater Department at Dartmouth College. From 1994-2004, he served as Artistic Director of The Cleveland Play House. During his tenure, he instituted several innovative artistic programs including the Associate Artists Program, The Next Stage Festival of New Plays, and the Professional Actor Training Program in partnership with Case Western Reserve University. Of the over 80 plays he produced at the Play House, several moved to Broadway and off-Broadway theaters, earning national distinctions including the AT&T OnStage and Obie awards. In addition to over twenty productions at the Play House, Mr. Hackett has directed at theaters across the country and abroad including the Denver Center Theater, the Alabama Shakespeare Festival, the GeVa Theater and the National Theater, Miskolc, Hungary. From 1980-88, he was a member of the Tony Award-winning Denver Center Theater Company serving variously as Acting Artistic Director, Associate Artistic Director for New Play Development, and Director of the National Theater Conservatory. Mr. Hackett is a graduate of Dartmouth College and received his MFA from the University of California, San Diego.

LINDA LEONARD (Musical Staging) Linda is thrilled to be a part of such an amazing team for this production. She has over 25 years of professional experience as a choreographer, director, actor and teacher here in the Metroplex and in Chicago and New York. Linda most recently directed *Dead Presidents Club* for Circle

Theatre and she played Vernelle in Echo Theatre's production of *Women and Horses....*. At Lyric Stage she was seen as the Tango Dancer and Dance Captain for *Evita* and she choreographed *I Do! I Do!*, *Gypsy* and *The Most Happy Fella* (she also played Rosabella). Linda was dance captain and played Ellie for Hal Prince's production of *Showboat* and she spent 3.5 years in the National and German companies of *Cats*, playing Jellylorum and Grizabella. Linda teaches at KD Actors Conservatory and she can be seen in *Fat Girls*, a new Ash Christian film, as a spokesperson for In Charge Debt and in the upcoming play, *A String of Pearls* for Echo Theatre. Linda is dedicated to the process of creativity and her husband Bill.

JAMES MCQUILLEN (Music Director) is happy to be back for his 15th production at Lyric Stage. As Musical Director, his credits here include *Evita*, *Desperate Measures*, *The Pajama Game*, *The Spectre Bridegroom* (Best Musical Director Rabin Award nominee), *A Day In Hollywood/A Night in the Ukraine*, and 2 *Dallas Divas* Concerts. Other productions at Lyric Stage he has been involved with include *Sweeney Todd*, *The Fantasticks*, *110 in the Shade*, *Follies*, and *Ragtime*. He has also been Musical Director of shows for the 2006 Edinburgh Fringe Festival, Casa Manana, Plano Repertory Theater, Circle Theater, and others. He has accompanied singers in the DFW area, Canada, and Germany, and is currently studying music at the University of North Texas. Upcoming projects include a Musical Theater Gala for the University of North Texas/Crested Butte Music Festival and *Master Class* here at Lyric.

JANE QUETIN (Property Design) is beginning her sixth year working with Lyric Stage. She is currently chair of the Brookhaven College Theater Department. Jane has also done props for Contemporary Theater of Dallas. She holds a B. A. degree from San Jose State University in California and an M. F. A. degree from the University of Utah.

MARGARET J. SOCH (Stage Manager) This is Maggie's twenty-first show with Lyric Stage. Other companies include: The Aspen Music Festival, Portland Repertory Theatre, The SMU Opera, The Idaho Shakespeare Festival, The Ft. Worth Opera and The El Paso Opera. She has been a member of Actors Equity for 17 years. Love to Tom and the family who support her.

JOE SUTTON (Writer/Lyricist) Joe's provocative plays about politics, race, real estate, the

Second Amendment, and other topical issues include *Voir Dire* (nominated for the Pulitzer Prize and the Best Play Award of the American Theatre Critics Association), *As It is in Heaven*, *The Benefits of Doubt*, *Black Market*, *The Third Army*, *Guns 'n Ammo*, *Restoring the Sun*, and *Enough is Enough*. In collaboration with choreographer Karol Armitage, Joe co-wrote *The Predator's Ball*, which premiered at the Maggio Musicale Festival in Florence, Italy, and enjoyed a subsequent run at the Brooklyn Academy of Music. Other theatres that have produced or premiered Joe's plays include New York Theater Workshop, the Long Wharf Theatre, Seattle Rep, Arena Stage, the Cleveland Play House, and the Old Globe. More recently, Seattle Children's Theatre commissioned and produced two works by Joe for young

audiences, *The Magic City* and *The Red Badge of Courage*. In February 2007, the Dallas Lyric Theater will present the world premiere of *The Winner*, a musical co-written with Lewis Flinn about Lyndon Baines Johnson's controversial race for the Senate in 1948. Joe is a recipient of numerous awards and honors, among them fellowships from the New York Foundation for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts, the FDG/CBS playwriting award, and New Dramatists' Joe A. Calloway Award. When not in rehearsal, or teaching playwriting at Dartmouth College, Joe resides in Montclair, NJ with his wife Anne and their sons James and Nicholas. He is currently working on a commission from the Southern Rep in New Orleans for a play about New Orleans and Hurricane Katrina.

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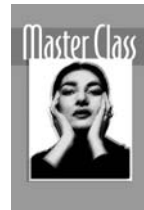


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
