Since 1993, Lyric Stage has grown to become one of North Texas' most honored nonprofit theatre companies, being both locally and nationally recognized for its work. For over 25 years, Founding Producer Steven Jones has remained committed to Lyric Stage's mission by: producing 125 productions including 2 Off-Broadway shows; creating over 3,000 jobs in Dallas County by remaining committed to employing local artists, technicians, and fabricators; developing and producing 21 world-premiere musicals; working with the R&H Organization, Julie Styne Estate, and Jerome Moross Family to restore and produce full, orchestral productions of such classics as CAROUSEL, THE KING & I, SHOWBOAT, GYPSY, and THE GOLDEN APPLE (recorded by PS Classics and available as the first full-length recording); working closely with native Texans Harvey Schmidt (composer) and Tom Jones (lyricist), creators of THE FANTASTICKS, to produce and preserve their works; and honoring excellence in local, high school musical theatre since 2010 by sponsoring The Schmidt and Jones Awards.

In 2017, after 24 seasons at the Irving Arts Center, Lyric Stage moved to producing at Dallas' historic Majestic Theatre, located in downtown Dallas, at 1925 Elm Street. The beautiful, 100-year p;d Baroque-style vaudeville theatre was, and is, the perfect fit for Lyric Stage's large-scale musicals, which always features local artists, actors, and the always live, Lyric Stage Orchestra.

In 2019, Catherine Carpenter Cox joined Lyric Stage as Producer, and has remained committed to sustaining and growing Founder Steven Jones' commitments to and legacy of producing high quality, locally produced, professional musical theatre. Cox also continues to honor Lyric Stage's mission by looking for ways to evolve and grow in the ever-changing landscape of the arts, so that future audiences and generations will

be able to experience the musical, a uniquely American art form.

THOUGHTS FROM THE DIRECTOR:

It seems ridiculous to write a mushy, artsy talk director's note for a 60's B movie-inspired black comedy musical about two out-of-sorts flower shop workers and an alien plant. Just like it's kind of ridiculous that this beach blanket/horror sci-fi spoof/rock concert of a show would become a cult classic, have a five-year off-Broadway run, and consistently stay in the top 3 most-produced high school shows, all while reliving a healthy mix of Drama Desk, Olivier, and Tony awards since its 1982 off-off Broadway premiere.

Little Shop of Horrors is unlike any other show I have worked on. It is nothing short of ridiculous and the rehearsal room embraced that liberation. I completely understand why this show is a staple to so many. It requires us to live in the absurd. It requires that judgement-y part of your brain to release the "is this stupid?" roadblock and focus instead on the playfulness. The rules that Ashman and Menken have established for the world of Skid Row leaves the artists with a playground straight out of our dreams and the game in the room becomes, how much fun can we have while honoring the truth of the absurdity?

If we were to talk about messages to walk away with, of course, it's "don't feed the plants." And with everything 2023 has thrown at us, we could absolutely extend that sentiment to include "don't dig up the sarcophagi," or "let's maybe leave the non-human biologics alone." But if your personal brand of chaos isn't ready to accept those messages, I hope you get to experience what we have enjoyed these last few weeks: a healthy (and overdue) dose of ridiculous hilarity. The world is heavy and loud, so what happens if, for a moment, we turn off the notifications and laugh with some strangers for a little while? It's certainly filled my bucket.
