ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Michael Serrecchia | Director

My professional career began in modern and classical dance with the Jose Limon Youth Company and The Harkness Ballet in NYC. It was at Harkness House that I met and studied with the great American Jazz teacher Luigi.

In NYC I studied acting with Mary Tarcai (Stanislavski) and Fred Kareman (Meisner Technique, Neighborhood Playhouse) Voice with Sylvia Sirlya of the Metropolitan Opera and the famous Keith Davis.

But mostly my training came from the practical experience of performing on Broadway for 18 years, in many original Broadway Musicals.

During my time in NYC I worked with, and learned from the best; Michael Bennett, Bob Fosse, Joe Layton, John Houseman, Jack O'Brien, Tommy Tune, Chita Rivera, Liza Minelli, Joel Grey, Carol Channing, Julie Wilson, Molly Picon, Gillian Lynne, Fred Ebb, John Kander, Cy Coleman, Marvin Hamlish, James Kirkwood, Sir Robert Helpman, each and every one of them helped build my own creative process.

As an original cast member of A Chorus Line, I was part of American Musical Theatre History. That experience was invaluable to my training. You can see me speak of this and other Broadway shows of the 60's, 70's and 80's in "Broadway; Beyond the Golden Years" released in 2011.

My approach to directing and choreography is basic Meisner... "to live truthfully under given imaginary circumstances". I strive to remain true to the author/composer's work and incorporate a strong point of view and style in agreement with the producer and ultimately the cast. I work within the parameters set by the production and cast. I never "force" a performance. I nurture it organically.

In 2011, I was selected for the Natalie Skelton Award for Artistic Excellence award for having "invested my life to artistry, teaching, and directing at a truly outstanding level." In 2015 I, along with the rest of the original cast of A Chorus Line, was honored at The Public Theatre in NYC for my contribution to the American Musical.



DEVELOPING AND PRESERVING THE MUSICAL, A UNIQUELY AMERICAN ART FORM

Since 1993, Lyric Stage has grown to become one of North Texas' most honored non-profit theatre companies, being both locally and nationally recognized for its work. For over 25 years, Founding Producer Steven Jones has remained committed to Lyric Stage's mission by: producing 125 productions including 2 Off-Broadway shows; creating over 3,000 jobs in Dallas County by remaining committed to employing local artists, technicians, and fabricators; developing and producing 21 world-premiere musicals; working with the R&H Organization, Julie Styne Estate, and Jerome Moross Family to restore and produce full, orchestral productions of such classics as CAROUSEL, THE KING & I, SHOWBOAT, GYPSY, and THE GOLDEN APPLE (recorded by PS Classics and available as the first full-length recording); working closely with native Texans Harvey Schmidt (composer) and Tom Jones (lyricist), creators of THE FANTASTICKS, to produce and preserve their works; and honoring excellence in local, high school musical theatre since 2010 by sponsoring The Schmidt and Jones Awards.

In 2017, after 24 seasons at the Irving Arts Center, Lyric Stage moved to producing at Dallas' historic Majestic Theatre, located in downtown Dallas, at 1925 Elm Street. The beautiful, 100-year p;d Baroque-style vaudeville theatre was, and is, the perfect fit for Lyric Stage's large-scale musicals, which always features local artists, actors, and the always live, Lyric Stage Orchestra.

In 2019, Catherine Carpenter Cox joined Lyric Stage as Producer, and has remained committed to sustaining and growing Founder Steven Jones' commitments to and legacy of producing high quality, locally produced, professional musical theatre. Cox also continues to honor Lyric Stage's mission by looking for ways to evolve and grow in the ever-changing landscape of the arts, so that future audiences and generations will be able to experience the musical, a uniquely American art form.
